Critique de la raison pratique - deuxième grand ouvrage critique de Kant et «suite» de la Critique de la raison pure (1781-1787), la Critique de la raison pratique abandonne l'analyse de la raison dans son usage spéculatif pour se consacrer à son usage pratique. Elle concerne donc le domaine de l'agir et non plus celui de la connaissance théorique. Elle aura une influence déterminante dans les champs de l'éthique et de la philosophie morale. L'une des innovations notables de la Critique de la raison pratique par rapport à la Fondation de la métaphysique des mœurs (1785) est l'apparition de la notion d'un faktum (fait non empirique) de la loi morale, qui s'impose à la raison alors même qu'elle ne peut être déduite analytiquement du concept positif de liberté et de dignité, puisque nous connaissons ce dernier par la loi morale, et non l'inverse. What is the cultural dimension of sustainability? This book offers a thought-provoking answer, with a theoretical synthesis on »cultures of sustainability«. Describing how modernity degenerated into a culture of unsustainability, to which the arts are contributing, Sacha Kagan engages us in a fundamental rethinking of our ways of knowing and seeing the world. L'actualité récente montre bien quel fossé il y a entre une partie de la jeunesse et ceux qui en appellent à l'Etat de droit. Michel Maffesoli propose dans cet essai de penser le non-rationnel, ou du moins d'équilibrer l'intellect et l'affect. D'abord en élaborant un savoir dionysien, au sens où Dionysos était le dieu des fêtes et du chaos. Ensuite, rompant avec l'idéal de raison abstraite héritée du siècle des Lumières, par la proximité que devrait avoir l'observateur avec les événements décrits : c'est justement la Raison sensible.

“We are our bodies”, “we have our bodies”, “we make our bodies”. This “three-headed” axiom has made the body the “parasite” of modern culture. The individual that is fit for modernity was, and certainly still is, expected and encouraged to embrace its corporeal existence in order to find an answer to one of the most frequently asked questions in the modern Western world: “Who am I?” For those who live in Western societies, with a history of individualism, the temptation is to look inside oneself, to examine one’s thoughts and feelings, as if self-identity is a treasure locked inside. The desire to change the skin one inhabits, to cite Almodóvar, has become “territorialized” in on-screen media, digital sites and social networks, shuffling the cards as if in an attempt to dance on the ruins of passing time. Everything is at play, everything is art. Madonna is like Michelangelo. Comic strips are like eight hundred page novels by Tolstoy. What is up for discussion is the advanced transformation of persons into spectators. The multiplication of screens creates a “visual party”. The definition of the boundaries between the social sensorium and today’s advanced technologies is the fundamental, and as yet unsolved, methodological problem arising from the contemporary “spatial turn” that is coming to maturity thanks to the re-orientation of the classical digital paradigm. “Reclaiming the social throughout embodied practices” (Greenwood, 1994) is basically the ultimate objective of this book. The thinking, feeling and acting body will figure as prominently as the mind, cognition, and rationality in combining the framework of the research and the methodology underpinning its development. The body is, indeed, the origin of humans’ most individual experiences and actions, since it is the point of application of the tuning and calibration of the senses and the general training of social skills. The notion of “body in action in context” is, consequently, the methodological proposal that *Beyond the Skin: The Boundaries between Bodies and Technologies in an Unequal World* offers to sociology, in order to surpass the “new alliance” between human senses and the new media, an alliance staged by bodies moving faster than thought across the maps of contemporary mobile spaces.

Myths are commonly associated with illusions or with deceptive, dangerous discourse, and are often perceived as largely the domain of premodern societies. But even in our post-industrial, technologically driven world, myths – Western or Eastern, ancient or modern, religious or scientific – are in fact powerful, pervasive forces. In Social Myths and Collective Imaginaries, Gérard Bouchard conceptualizes myths as vessels of sacred values that transcend the division between primitive and modern. Myths represent key elements of collective imaginaries, past and present. In all societies there are values and beliefs that hold sway over most of the population. Whether they come from religion, political institutions, or other sources, they enjoy exalted status and go largely unchallenged. These myths have the power to bring societies together as well as pull them apart. Yet the study of myth has been largely neglected by sociologists and other social scientists. Bouchard navigates this uncharted territory by addressing a number of fundamental questions: What is the place of myth in contemporary societies and in the relations between the cultural and the social? How do myths take form? From what do they draw their strength? How do they respond to shifting contexts? Myths matter, Bouchard argues, because of the energy they unleash, energy that enables a population to mobilize and rally around collective goals. At the same time myths work to alleviate collective anxiety and to meet the most pressing challenges facing a society. In this bold analysis, Bouchard challenges common assumptions and awakens us to the transcendent power of myth in our daily lives and in our shared aspirations.

The Disobedient Generation collects newly written autobiographies by an international cross-section of well-known sociologists, all of them “children of the ’60s”. It illuminates the human experience of living through that decade as apprentice scholars and activists, encountering the issues of class, race, the Establishment, the decline of traditional religion, feminism, war, and the sexual revolution. In each case the interlinked crises

of young adulthood, rapid change, and nascent professional careers shaped this generation's private and public selves.
